

Thinking about the last 18 months, and about what you know about us and other schools, do you think we did a good enough job to help keep your child safe and educated during the pandemic?



Now that we are back in school, are you happy with us trying to go back to normal?



COMMENTS RECEIVED FROM PARENTS AT THE END OF THE SHORT

SURVEY (35 comments in total; tis was not a compulsory part of the survey and parents could add a comment if they wanted to):

As a family we couldn't have asked for more from school during this difficult time. There was always someone to reach out to if we were struggling with work or just had general concerns about balancing our child's school work alongside working from home. School response (via Class Dojo):

"Although we appreciate the difficulties having this gate closed can pose, we decided to do this due to the fact that EYFS pupils are allowed in to school earlier than the rest of school; this gives children time to make the short walk from the EYFS gate to the main school gate in time for their door to open. These doors are also kept open until 9.05am, hence there should be enough time for this. We also decided to keep the gates closed as some families and pupils who were not in EYFS used this as a cut-through and often played with the equipment set up outside for children to use in their continuous provision. Sadly, some parents also did not close the gate behind them which meant that it was left open for others to close. As the term progresses we will rethink this approach and if it seems workable we will consider opening this gate again. Thank you for your suggestion though."

Regarding clubs, I think that the school is not offering enough options to enrich the children's education after school, compare to other schools, and especially in a school with higher than the average disadvantaged children. I feel that the school could have a much wider offer of clubs after school for all years eg music, dancing, sports, etc

School Response (via Class Dojo):

I am being cautious in regards to clubs. We have BIG plans in school and this half term you will see approximately eight clubs (including our great Breakfast Club) being offered to different classes and year groups. Before COVID, we had the BEST after-school club offer in the area. In 2019-2020 we ran over 25 after school clubs - and all of these were FREE. This WILL happen again; but I want to bring things in gradually over the following weeks. This is why you will start seeing some clubs being offered this half term and even more after the October break.

For those of you who worry that not having all of these clubs running after school will impact on the enrichment of a child's education; please note that we have prided ourselves on the fact that we have offered a FULL curriculum throughout the pandemic and offered many things in school to help with well-being and health. Without sounding too big-headed, I know that some schools struggled with this – but we didn't. In the Summer, some trips started to happen again, and only today I have been signing forms for more to take place in the next coming weeks. We have also made sure to advertise any other clubs for our children running in the local areas (such as the Salford Scorpions NFL flag football club, the Guides and the local football clubs). Like you, I want the BEST for our children - and they will get this, but for now, we will take one step at a time.

Last week we tried some things; they worked. This week we are adding more things; it seems to be working...and so we will carry on like this; bit by bit, week by week.

I understand that we have to get back to normal and the quicker the better, however we have seen an increase in number of cases and hospitalisation. I think still being cautious and wearing masks can help prevent further spread and less disruption i.e class closures etc. I just feel that many people have taken the latest advise and thought we are over the pandemic and life can continue as before, and not being cautious enough.

School Response (via Class Dojo):

It is important to note that some people seem to be unhappy with going back to a more normal timetable, whereas others think that we should be opening up school even more and offering more things after school etc etc.

This is a careful balancing act and I know that I cannot make everyone 100% happy all at once...but I do have BIG plans. Please all be assured that I spent a very long time risk-assessing our September start. I have tried my best to find a 'middle ground' here as many schools have removed all measures and the DfE/Government have clearly said that schools should not have bubbles, do not need to socially distance etc. Whilst following these rules I have also ensured that we retain some measures linked to personal choice.

Anyone walking around the school will still see some measures in place; we've not got rid of everything; this is to minimise the risk of a future COVID outbreak. Please be patient with us. Remember, we have BIG AMBITIONS and I will not let your child/children down. I also DO NOT want to EVER send a class home again...this is my aim. I am hopeful that the approach we are using will ensure this.
