The Pupil Premium is an allocation of additional funding provided to schools to support specific groups of children who are vulnerable to possible underachievement. These include pupils who are entitled to free school meals, those looked after by the local authority and children of armed service personnel. The intended effect of this funding at Primrose Hill Primary school is to accelerate progress, raise attainment, increase engagement, widen aspiration, provide equality of opportunity and ensure that children eligible for this funding are performing at least as well as their non-ppg peers. Lauren Collins is the Pupil Premium Lead at Primrose Hill Primary School. Mr Alan Ferns is our school's named governor for Pupil Premium.
