

## PUPIL PREMIUM IMPACT REPORT 2016-2017

### KEY STAGE 2 RESULTS

#### ATTAINMENT

50% working at Expected Standard	40% working at Expected Standard	-10%	<p>Despite a new reading initiative and intervention sessions, pupils in receipt of the PPG performed worse than their peers at the end of KS2. This shows that the PPG was not used effectively enough. Evidence and data suggests that a more focused approach to the teaching of reading, and specialised tuition groups is required. School also needs to ensure that more pupils in receipt of the PPG reach higher than expected standards.</p> <p>School is pleased to note however that there was only 1 point difference in the average scaled scores between all and disadvantaged pupils (99 for all pupils; 98 for disadvantaged).</p>

47% working at Expected Standard	50% working at Expected Standard	+3%	<p>Pupils in receipt of the PPG outperformed their non-disadvantaged peers. This is largely attributed to the use of additional staff to support PPG children with their writing work. Sadly no disadvantaged pupils exceeded expected standards in writing, whereas 3% of all pupils did. This is an area of focus for 2017-18.</p>

47% working at Expected Standard	40% working at Expected Standard	-7%	<p>Despite additional adult support, pupils in receipt of the PPG performed worse than their peers at the end of KS2. Self-evaluations show a lack of specific maths support for PPG children. The use of PiXL therapies, along with enhancing staff to specifically teach these interventions, will become an area of focus for 2017-18.</p> <p>Average scaled scores show a difference of -2% when compared to their non-disadvantaged peers</p>



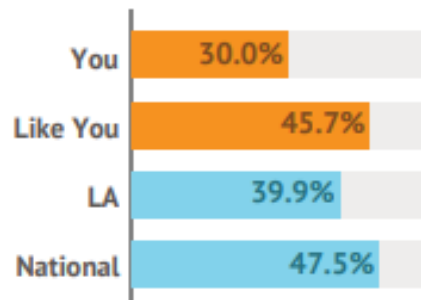

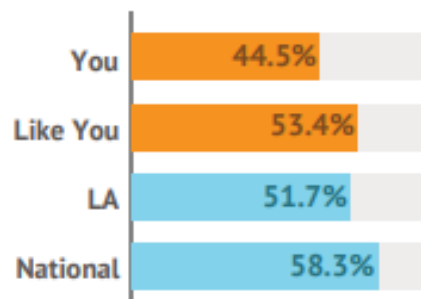


The percentage of disadvantaged students at Primrose Hill Primary School and Children's Centre achieving the expected standard in reading, writing & maths is 15.7% less than the similar schools average, and 9.9% lower than the LA average. The school gap has narrowed by 1.8% since last year.

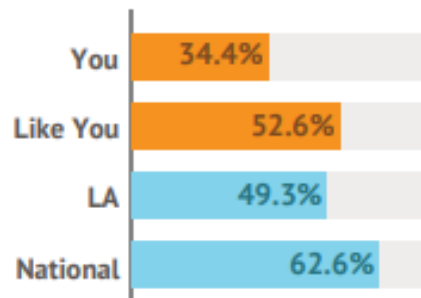


The percentage of EAL students achieving the expected standard in reading, writing & maths is 8.9% lower than the similar schools average, and 7.2% less than the LA average. The school gap has narrowed by 19.4% since last year.

The percentage of non-mobile pupils achieving the expected standard in reading, writing & maths is 18.2% less than the similar schools average, and 14.9% lower than the LA average. The school gap has widened by 2.1% since last year.

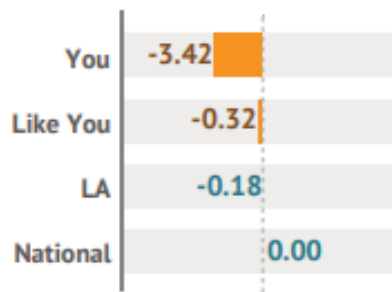
**PROGRESS MEASURES IN READING, WRITING AND MATHS FOR DISADVANTAGED PUPILS WAS MUCH WEAKER THAN PROGRESS FOR THEIR NON-DISADVANTAGED PEERS.** MATHS WAS PARTICULARLY POOR. IT IS OBVIOUS THAT THE SCHOOL NEEDS TO DO MORE TO ENSURE THAT CHILDREN IN RECEIPT OF THE PPG DO AT LEAST AS WELL AS THEIR NON-DISADVANTAGED PEERS. THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN DISADVANTAGED AND NON-DISADVANTAGED PERFORMANCE AT THE END OF KS1 IS NOW WIDER THAN IT WAS IN 2016-17.

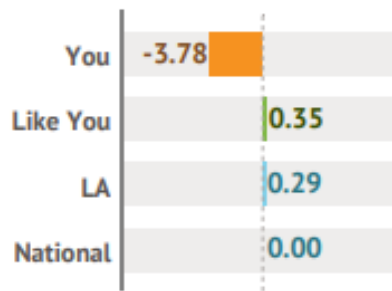


At Primrose Hill Primary School and Children's Centre the reading Overall Progress Score is -3.42. This is 3.10 less than the average for similar schools, 3.24 less than the average for LA and 3.42 less than the national average.

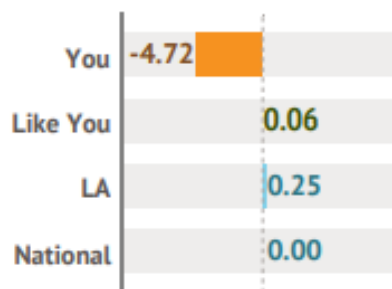


At Primrose Hill Primary School and Children's Centre the writing Overall Progress Score is -3.78. This is 4.13 less than the average for Like You, 4.07 lower than the average for LA and 3.78 less than the national average.

### Progress Score in Maths

At Primrose Hill Primary School and Children's Centre the maths Overall Progress Score is -4.72. This is 4.78 lower than the average for Like You, 4.97 lower than the average for LA and 4.72 lower than the national average.

### Pupil Premium Success At Key Stage 1

Disadvantaged pupils out-performed their KS1 peers in Reading, Writing and Maths. School needs to analyse these successes carefully and apply this knowledge to the work being done in KS2. Although there was only a +1% difference in scores for Reading and Writing at the end of KS1, there was a significant difference in performance for maths – with +5% more disadvantaged pupils reaching age-expected standards.

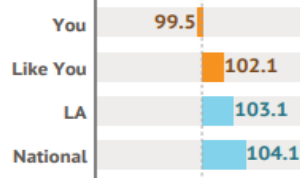

**99.5**

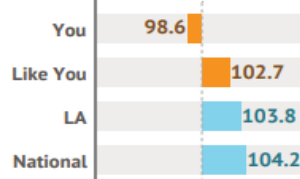


At Primrose Hill Primary School and Children's Centre the AvSS for reading is 99.5. This is 2.6 less than the average for similar schools, 3.6 lower than the average for LA and 4.6 less than the national average.

**98.6**

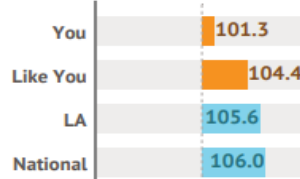

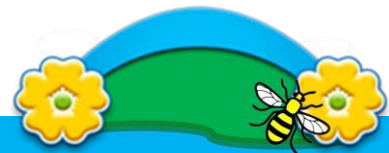
##### Average Scaled Score in EGPS

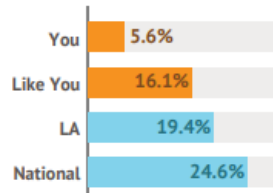

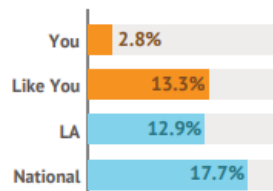

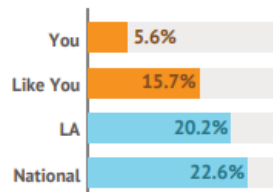

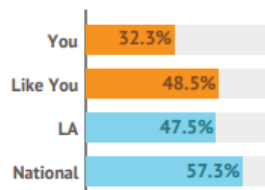

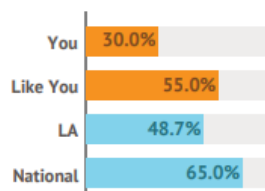

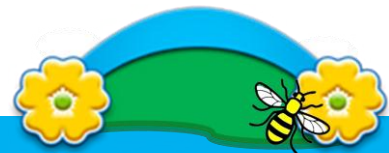
**Girls Achieving the Expected Standard in Reading, Writing & Maths**

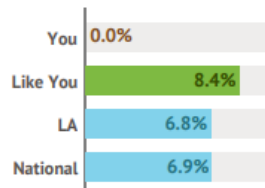

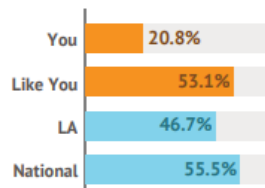


The percentage of low prior attainers at Primrose Hill Primary School and Children's Centre achieving the expected standard in reading, writing & maths is 8.4% less than the similar schools average, and 6.8% less than the LA average. The school gap has widened by 0.9% since last year.

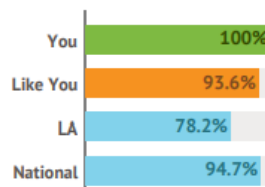

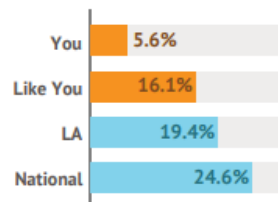

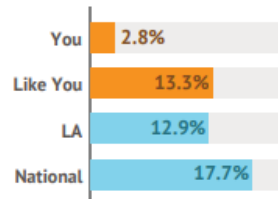

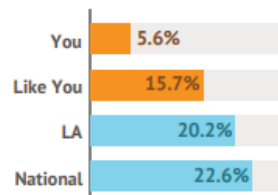
