Encompass Parents Awareness Letter

January 2026

Dear Parent/Carer,

Re: Operation Encompass

For the last few years, the school has been given the opportunity to take part in a project that runs jointly between schools and Greater Manchester Police. Although I have sent a copy of this letter out in previously, I do send a new copy of this letter out annually as I am aware that some families are new to our school and may not have received this before.

Operation Encompass has been designed to provide early reporting to schools, i.e. prior to the start of the next school day, of any domestic abuse incidents that occur outside of school, but which might have an impact on a child attending school the following day. During the school term this information will be shared on school days. When incidents occur on a Friday, Saturday or a Sunday, the police will contact the relevant school the following Monday.

A nominated member of school staff, known as a Key Adult, will be trained to liaise with the police. At Primrose Hill our Key Adult is Sue Doolan. They will be able to use information that has been shared with them, in confidence, to ensure that the school is able to support children and their families. Information will be shared where it is identified that a child or young person was present, witnessed or was involved in a domestic abuse incident.

We always endeavour to offer the best support possible to our pupils and believe that Operation Encompass is going to be beneficial and supportive for all concerned; children and families
